We have found new, affordable, space just two blocks from John Muir Elementary at the former Chubby & Tubby annex location (now Prudential RNT offices), located at the corner of Rainier Ave & Walden St.

The new space meets our current and future office needs, and with the addition of a community room and classrooms, it gives us the capacity to add more programming options and to connect deeper with our community.

It is important to note that our in-school programs and staff will remain in our current schools.

Only our administrative staff will move to the new location.

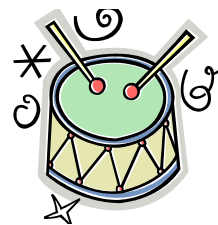

Registration Information

1. **Registration deadline** Winter 2012 Term is Friday, January 13th, 2012. Term will begin Wednesday, January 18, 2012. Space is limited, so please register early. Make checks payable to: Powerful Schools.

In Person: Registration with payments may be dropped off at any of the Powerful Schools during regular school hours.

We are sorry for the inconvenience, but due to overwhelming demand, we are no longer able to accept phone registrations. Please mail your registration, bring registration form directly to your school office or give to the Powerful Schools site coordinator .

2. **Locations:** Unless otherwise stated, classes are held at one of the six Powerful Schools. All classes will begin and end in the lunchroom. You **must** sign out your child in the lunchroom at the end of class.
3. **Tuition:** Class tuition is noted in the course description. Tuition is due at the beginning of each session, unless special permission is given by the site coordinator and a payment plan has been arranged.

Partial/ Full Scholarships: Scholarships are awarded based on need and a first come, first serve basis. You may request one full scholarship per family. In order to do so, Powerful Schools needs verification of income (**food stamp card, public access medical, etc. are acceptable**). **You must send income verification along with your registration. This information will be considered confidential and not shared with anyone.**

4. **Course Cancellation:** Powerful Schools reserves the right to cancel or modify classes when necessary. Courses are canceled if the minimum enrollment of students is not reached before the first class meeting. If a course is canceled, students and parents will be notified by phone.

Refund Policy:

- When classes are canceled by Powerful Schools, complete refunds are given.
- Students who withdraw before the second class will receive 75% of their tuition costs.
- After the second class, no refunds will be given.
- Powerful Schools reserves the right to terminate students' enrollment from class (es) and/or program when behavior expectations are not met.

5. **Late Fee Policy:** At the end of the student's assigned class the authorized pick-up person will be given a **5 minute grace** period to pick-up their child(ren). After 5 minutes, a late fee **of \$1 per minute** will be instituted. Late fees are to be paid in full to the staff on duty prior to the subsequent class. We request parents to make alternative pick-up plans in case of an emergency and notify Powerful Schools staff. **Two late pick-ups are cause for termination from the program.** If any child is still at the school after the site coordinator's shift has ended, the **Seattle Police or Child Protective Services will be contacted.**
6. Please mark your course dates on your calendar. **A Confirmation Letter will be sent home.**
